In her final days, she often reminded her immediate family that she had no fear, as she had lived a meaningful and fulfilling life!

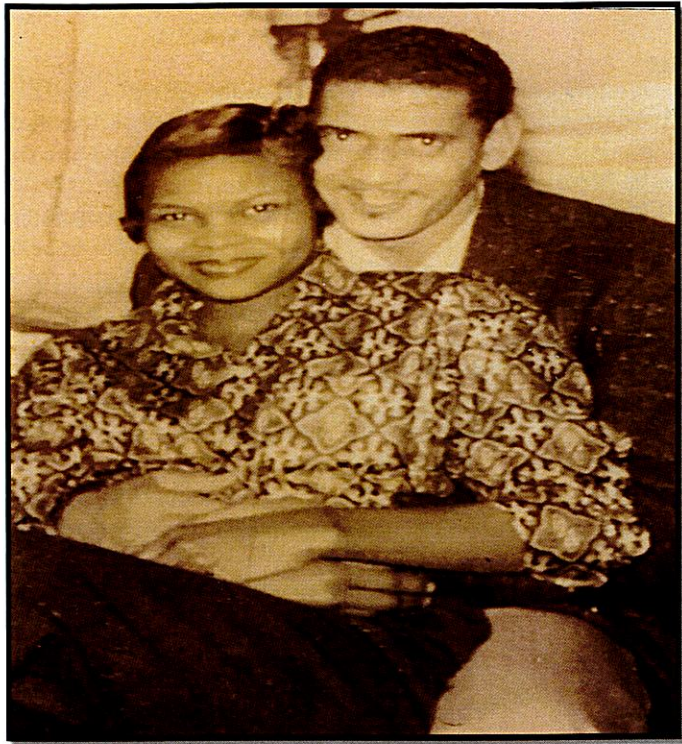
