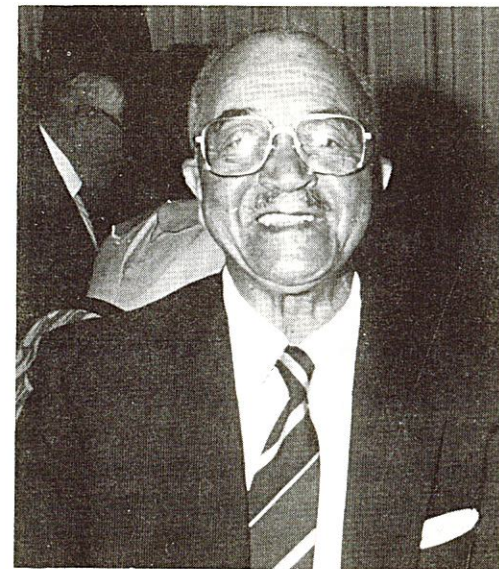

John met and married Elizabeth Leslie and to this union, two children were born: John Leslie and Victoria Carol.

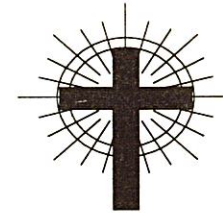
After the closing of Union Terminal, John started to work at G.E. for 10 years when he retired.
