Obituary

Margaret Ann Young (nee Webb) was born on December 28, 1941, in Covington, Kentucky to the union of the late James and Blanche (nee Robinson) Webb. The only daughter and second of four children, blessed by this union. Margaret was preceded in death by her brothers Raymond Edward and David Allen. She departed this life on August 19, 2021, at St. Elizabeth Hospice Care Unit in Edgewood, Kentucky.

Margaret accepted Jesus Christ as her personal savior at an early age and was baptized on January 28, 1950, uniting with Ninth Street Baptist Church in Covington, Kentucky, under the pastorate of Rev. G.M. Lacey. She later united with Boaz Missionary Baptist Church in Covington, Kentucky. After moving to Erlanger, Kentucky, she united with First Baptist Church in Elsmere, Kentucky. As a faithful and dedicated member of First Baptist, Margaret served as a Trustee, Church Clerk, and Usher until health issues no longer enabled her to do so.

She attended Kentucky State College for two years, earning Dean's list status each of her four semesters, and became a member of Delta Sigma Theta Sorority. She was employed for 26 years as a secretary for the Covington Independent Public School System, retiring January 2, 1997.

Margaret was united in marriage to James Crawford Young, "the boy next door", on June 10, 1961. To this blessed union two sons: James Jr. (Ursala) and Michael Allen (Stephanie) were born. Margaret and James celebrated 59 years of marriage until his death on February 15, 2021.
